# HOMECOMING FEATURES BATTLE OF CONFERENCE UNBEATENS

UW-Eau Claire Blugolds (3-1, 2-0) at UW-Stout Blue Devils (4-0, 2-0) Saturday, October 7, 1 p.m.

Menomonie, Wis., Nelson Field

**ON THE LINE**: If at the beginning of the season anyone would have suggested that UW-Stout and UW-Eau Claire would be playing for the conference lead - at any point in the season - they would have been soundly laughed out of the building. But here they are, both teams with unblemished conference records, and the Blue Devils garnering a 13th place national ranking. This is Blue Devils' homecoming.

LAST TIME OUT: Stout: He didn't win the game single handedly, but Eric Lund certainly put the Blue Devils on the right track, picking up two UW-River Falls fumbles and rumbling for TDs, as Stout controlled the second half on their way to a 34-13 win at River Falls. Lund's first score came just before halftime to put Stout on the board, tightening the score at 10-7. Kevin McCulley tied the game at 10-10 with a 34-yard field goal as time ran out in the first half. Stout added 10 more points in the third quarter. Lund got his second score two minutes into the fourth quarter to give Stout a 27-13 lead. Luke Bundgaard added a touchdown for the final score. Stout had not won at River Falls since the 1981 season. The Blue Devils defense gave up 270 rushing yards, but 100 of that came on two long gainers. Stout gathered 203 total yards to River Falls' 295.

**Eau Claire**: Darrell Souradha carried the ball 51 times for a conference record 303 yards as the Blugolds handed UW-Platteville a 30-6 defeat to spoil the Pioneers' homecoming. Souradha scored two touchdowns, his first giving the Blugolds a 10-6 lead in the third quarter. His second came just minutes later on a 26-yard scamper. The Blugold defense provided the scoring in the fourth quarter when Austin Crow picked up a fumble and went 45 yards to score and Jay Hoyord returned an inteception 81 yards for the score. The Blugolds picked up 484 total yards (308 on the ground) while holding Platteville's air-minded attack to 276 yards (220 in the air).

**LAST YEAR:** Both Stout and Eau Claire are members of the eight-team Wisconsin Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (WIAC) and are affiliated with the NCAA Division III. Stout was 2-8 overall, 1-6 (eighth) in the WIAC. The Blugolds were 2-8 overall, 2-5 (6th tie) in the WIAC.

**THE SERIES**: This will be the 74th meeting of the two teams that are only 25 miles apart and the Blugolds hold a 42-25-6 advantage in the series. Kevin McCulley kicked a 33-yard field goal with 15 seconds left on the clock to lift Stout to a 22-20 win last season. The Blue Devils outgained Eau Claire, 372-287. The Blugolds Darrell Souradha rushed 27 times for 129 yards, while Stout's Marty Goryl passed for 300 yards and a TD. McCulley kicked three field goals. Stout has won the last two games, and the two teams have split the last 10 games.

**STOUT COACH ED MEIERKORT SAYS**: "I'm not sure our players understood exactly what we did against River Falls. River Falls does not get beat at home very often. Our defense had the confidence to give us the ball and the wind. Our offense did exactly what we needed them to do in the second half.

"We are 2-0, they are 2-0, it's our homecoming, we are playing our arch-rival. I don't think you will be able to go anywhere in the country and find a more festive atmosphere. Our No. 1 goal is to avenge the homecoming loss from last season. (A 47-0 loss to River Falls) It doesn't make a difference what team we are playing. Darrell Souradha is the premier running back in the league. If we are to beat Eau Claire, we have to slow him down. He has great vision and is very tough. He doesn't mind taking a hit. Their offensive line is doing a good job. It's big that our defense plays well up front.

"This team (Stout's) has nothing in common with last year's team, and it's obvious by the win at River Falls. It is a totally different mindset."

# **BLUE DEVILS STAY UNDEFEATED, DOWN RIVER FALLS, 34-13**

RIVER FALLS - Eric Lund (Sr, Ashland) returned two fumbles for touchdowns to spur UW-Stout to a 34-13 win over UW-River Falls in Wisconsin Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (WIAC) action Saturday, Sept. 30 at River Falls.

While the Blue Devil offense was sputtering in the first half, and Stout trailing 10-0, Lund picked up a loose ball and rumbled 18 yards for the score with five minutes left in the half. The Blue Devils (4-0, 2-0) drove again to close out the half, and **Kevin McCulley (Sr, Fond du Lac)** knotted the score with a 37-yard field goal. With a lack of an effective offensive attack, the Blue Devils knew they had dodged a bullet. "The key in the game was when we came out of the first half with a 10-10 tie," Stout coach Ed Meierkort said. "We made some mistakes in the first half, but then we took over the game in the second half."

And take over they did. **Justin Fjeldstad (Jr, Minneapolis, Minn)**, one of three quarterbacks Stout used, scored midway through the third quarter on a 26-yard draw. A few minutes later, Blue Devil linebacker **Steve Miller (Sr, Lodi)** recovered a fumble, setting up McCulley's 22-yard field goal. The Falcons (1-3, 0-2) did answer back in the third period. Running back Andy Krueger cracked off a long gainer, setting up a 34-yard field goal. But Stout, ranked 13th in the latest American Football Coaches' Association (AFCA) poll, would hold the Falcons at bay. McCulley pinned the Falcons deep with a long punt - he averaged 47 yards per punt, including a school record 82-yard punt.

Moments later, Lund picked up his second fumble, going 10 yards to paydirt. Luke Bundgaard (Fr, Weyerhauser) spread gloom an any Falcon chance when he closed out the scoring late in the quarter. Eric Moe (So, Hixton) put the punctuation mark on the game when he picked off a pass as time ran out.

Final stats do not totally tell the entire story of this game. The Falcons, ranked seventh nationally in rushing yards, finished with 270 yards on the ground and 25 through the air for 295 yards. More than 100 yards came on two long runs. The key stat was the loss of five of six fumbles. The Blue Devils, who also fumbled the ball three times, ran for 147 yards and passed for 56 yards for 203 total yards, by far their lowest offensive output of the season.

That stat did not deter Meierkort. "Our offense did exactly what they had to in the second half," Meierkort said. A key to Stout's success was a change on the defensive line where **Jeff Hazuga (Sr, Thorp)** was moved over the center and nose guard **Matt Mueller (Fr, Chaska, Minn)** was moved down the line, in essence giving Stout a four man line. "We didn't think they would be able to beat us on the perimeter, and they didn't except for a couple of long runs," Meierkort said. The Falcons' Rob Ohman led all rushers with 118 yards, while Kruger finished with 78. Bundgaard led Stout with 64 yards rushing. "I don't think our players understand what they did here today," Meierkort added. "River Falls doesn't lose here very often."

## STOUT'S SPIELMAN RECEIVES FOOTBALL HONORS

**MENOMONIE** - UW-Stout's **Jamie Spielman (So, Menomonie)** was named the Wisconsin Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (WIAC) defensive player of the week and was also named to the D3football.com Team of the Week for his efforts in the Blue Devils' 16-8 win over UW-Stevens Point, Sept. 23. Spielman, a linebacker, keyed a stingy defense that allowed a minus-ten yards rushing (110 total yards). Spielman had 16 total tackles, five solo, seven tackles for losses of 22 yards, one pass break up and 1.5 sacks for 16 yards.

# SOCCER TEAM PUTS A CRIMP INTO PLATTEVILLE HOMECOMING

**PLATTEVILLE** - The UW-Stout soccer team rode into UW-Platteville on homecoming day and rode out having silenced a partisan crowd, dominating the Pioneers, 5-0, Saturday, Sept. 30 in Platteville. From the opening whistle, Stout dominated possession, firing a barrage of shots at the Pioneer net, but it was not until **Kate Knoespel (So, Green Bay)** chased down a loose ball in the right corner - her cross pulled back to the top of the penalty area - where **Becky Howard (Sr, Wauwatosa)** was waiting to laser it into the far corner of the net.

The Blue Devils (5-5, 3-1) followed their first score with a determined effort to finish the match, but despite winning a dozen corner kicks, were unable to add to their advantage. **Stacy Normington's (So, Delavan)** blazing header scorched just wide in the 18th minute, Kristin Hoppe (Fr, Coon Rapids, Minn) flicked a **Raina Schneider (So, Sheboygan)** cross into the path of **Becca Carlson (Sr, Rosemount, Minn)** but her goal was called off as Hoppe was ruled to have interfered with the Pioneer keeper as the half reached its midpoint. Five minutes later, **Diane Ehlen (Fr, Bloomington, Minn)** found **Lisa Kardell (Jr, Ocean City, NJ)** at the far post, but her flick on attempt was just wide of the mark. With halftime looming, **Kristi Field (Fr, Bloomington, Minn)** outhustled a pair of defenders and found Kardell ghosting in on the far post - her finish doubled Stout's advantage with a quarter hour left in the opening frame.

The Blue Devils, egged on by a loud Pioneer cheering section, picked up right where they left off in the second half. Four minutes in, Howard sliced through the Pioneer midfield and set **Nellie Sivertsen** (**So**, **River Falls**) loose behind the defense. With Stout continuing to pressure, **Beth Bushman's** (**Sr**, **Eagan**, **Minn**) 18 yard effort nearly found the near corner. Knoespel ran onto a cross by **Andrea Anthony**, (**Fr**, **New Brighton**, **Minn**) but her effort was also saved. Even as Stout substituted liberally, a fourth goal seemed inevitable. It arrived on a 40 yard effort by Field. Field jumped on an errant pass in the midfield and fired a shot that skipped past the keeper. At the hour mark, Field again had a hand in Stout's offensive output. She jumped on a loose ball in midfield, took two dribbles and hit Howard in stride as she found a seam in the Pioneer defense. Field had a field day, picking up a goal and two assists.

In the 80th minute, **Amy Boyle (Fr, Racine)** found a seam at the top of the penalty area, but her low drive got only a diving save. In the 83rd minute Bushman found **Heather Pihl (Sr, Cottage Grove, Minn)** at the far post. Pihl's rocket shot was punched out by a defender, drawing Stout's third penalty kick of the season. Bushman's shot ricocheted off the inside of the left post with keeper well beaten. The Blue Devils outshot the Pioneers, 18-1, with **Jessie Sutherland (Jr, Duluth, Minn)** splitting the shutout with **Rachel McCabe (Fr, Appleton)**. The victory kept Stout in the WIAC race with a 3-1 record.

"This gives us some bounce going into a tough week," said coach Dave Morris, "we've got Eau Claire midweek and then Oshkosh for homecoming, so we were 1-1 last week and now we'll have to prepare to give ourselves the best chance at Eau Claire." The Blue Devils' next home match is Saturday, October 7 at noon against UW-Oshkosh (the game will air on channel 11 in Eau Claire Sunday, Oct. 8 at 6 p.m.).

**STEVENS POINT** - By the time UW-Stout's **Nellie Sivertsen (So, River Falls)** scored the Blue Devils' lone goal, UW-Stevens Point had already knocked in seven goals and the Pointers went on to hand the Devils their first conference loss, a 10-1 decision at Stevens Point, Thursday, Sept. 28. Stout (4-5, 2-1) should have figured it was going to be a long day when the Pointers' Marie Muhvic scored two goals within the first 10 minutes of play, as the Pointers (7-4, 4-0) ran off to a 4-0 halftime lead. Sivertsen got the Blue Devils on the board in the 53rd minute, taking a shot by **Becky Howard (Sr, Wauwatosa)** off the post. The goal was Sivertsen's third of the year, and Howard's fourth assist.

Palmer finished the tournament with 60 kills in 13 games, averaging 4.62 kills per game. She also racked up six solo blocks and 10 assisted blocks. Eidet had 25 kills, while Bogenschutz averaged 10.85 assists and three digs per game.

The Blue Devils will return to Eau Claire Wednesday, Oct. 4 to face the Blugolds, then will host UW-La Crosse, Friday, Oct. 6 at 7 p.m. and UW-Platteville, Saturday, Oct. 7 at 1:30 p.m.

**MENOMONIE** - Building on an improved performance the previous night, the UW-Stout tennis team shuffled their lineup and captured their first win of the season, taking a 5-4 win over St. Mary's, Saturday, Sept. 30 in Menomonie.

After dropping two of three doubles matches, the Blue Devils came back to win four of six singles matches. With the team match on the line, Maria Medin (Fr, Fifty Lakes, Minn) and Megan Schwanbeck (So, Lake City, Minn) had to bring their matches inside after a brief shower made the playing surface too slick to continue.

The slippery court took Medin to her knees late in the final set, but she prevailed at No. 3 singles, blanking Beth Carroll, 6-0, in the first set, then took the win, 6-4.
