## STOUT OPENS HOME & CONFERENCE SEASON WITH OSHKOSH

UW-Oshkosh Titans (3-0, 0-0) at UW-Stout Blue Devils (1-0, 0-0)

Saturday, Sept. 25, 1 p.m. • Don & Nona Williams Stadium, Menomonie, Wis. ON THE LINE: The Todd Strop era began with a shutout win two weeks ago at DePauw University, then the Blue

Devils had last week off. How the Blue Devils respond to the layoff in this conference opener will be key. UW-Oshkosh, on the other hand, has been busy the last three weeks and have outscored opponents by an average of 46-13. LAST TIME OUT: Stout: UW-Stout pitched their first shutout since the opening game of the 1993 as Stout opened

the 2004 season with a 23-0 win at DePauw University, Sept. 11. Nick Ohman rushed for 116 yards and a TD and threw two TDs, one to John Henry Freeman and another to Jesse Wendt. Ohman completed 23 passes for 216 yards. Tight end Ross Jones pulled in six catches for 81 yards. Tailback Ryan Englebert ran 18 times for 58 yards and pulled in eight passes for 28 yards.

Oshkosh: The Titans crushed Albion College, 40-0, Saturday in their home opener, their first shutout in 32 games. Offense, defense and special teams all scored. Oshkosh piled up 410 yards of total offense, 219 passing, 191 on the ground. The offense scored two TDs, but so did the defense as Scott Salvinski scored on a fumble recovery in the first period and Craig Korth returned an interception 38 yards. In all, the Titans had four interceptions, two by Bryan Kent, and recovered two fumbles. Lucas Raschke added two second period field goals. Nick Wara completed 14 passes for 182 yards. Aaron Chaltry rushed for 77 yards and two TDs.

LAST SEASON: Stout and Oshkosh are both members of the eight-team Wisconsin Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (WIAC). Last season, Stout was 6-4 overall, 4-3 (tied for fourth with Eau Claire) in the WIAC. Oshkosh was 4-6 overall, 1-6 (tied for seventh) in league play.

THE SERIES: Oshkosh leads the series, 26-20-1, a series that began in 1947 with a 19-12 Oshkosh win. In the 21st century, Stout has victories in the even numbered years, while the Titans have won during the odd years. The Titans upended the Blue Devils last season, 15-7, at Oshkosh. Mike Kinateder kicked three field goals and Andrew Stern ran for a five yard score before Stout got on the board. Stout quarterback Nick Ohman scored on a 10-yard run with a minute left in the game to avoid a shutout only days after two Blue Devils players were critically injured in an auto accident.

COACHES: Stout coach Todd Strop (1-0 career) is in his first year as the Blue Devil head coach and was the Blue Devils' defensive coordinator the last six seasons. Oshkosh coach Phil Meyer (17-25) is in his fifth year as the Titans' coach.

STOUT COACH TODD STROP SAYS: "This was a terrible time for a break. We work three weeks, then have some success, then we have to rest. But it did allow us to make some corrections and improvements, plus get over any minor nicks and bumps.

"(Against DePauw) we controlled the game, but we have to learn to finish. We went 170 yards on two drives, and only scored three points (in the first half). We did put (QB) Nick (Ohman) in position to make some plays. Our offense is keyed for the receivers to make big plays, and we didn't do that except for (TE Ross) Jones. I thought defensively, we did a good job.

"Oshkosh is a team that has been waiting (coach Phil) Mayer's recruiting classes to dome into the fray. Their offensive line has been together for three years and has developed into a good line. Defensively, they have their whole front seven back. We can't turn the ball over and some of our playmakers have to make the plays."

# **BLUE DEVIL VOLLEYBALL HANDS PLATTEVILLE FIRST LOSS OF THE YEAR**

**MENOMONIE** - After a dismal loss the night before, the UW-Stout volleyball team came to life and defeated 10th ranked UW-Platteville, 3-1, Saturday, Sept. 18 at Johnson Fieldhouse. Coming off a disappointing 3-1 loss to UW-La Crosse Friday night after easily downing the Eagles in the first game, the Blue Devils (10-2, 2-1 WIAC) shot out to a 30-19 first game win against Platteville, then came back with a 30-23 second game win. The Pioneers (11-1, 2-1) snagged the third game, 30-22, and were poised to repeat what they did the night before at UW-River Falls. Trailing 2-0 after the first two games, Platteville came back to win the final three and the match. But Stout would not let Platteville back into the fourth and deciding game, as Stout controlled throughout much of the game, winning 30-20. **Tanille Hartwig (Sr, Athens)** led the way in the fourth game, putting down five kills. **Brooke Viegut (Sr, Abbotsford)** finished the afternoon with 16 kills to lead Stout, while Hartwig tallied 15. The Pioneer's Andrea Coffman led all players with 18 kills. Mal Dzubay finished with 14. As a team, Stout, which is ranked 16th nationally, tallied only three service aces, but did not allow a single Pioneer service ace.

# **EAGLES TURN THE TABLES ON BLUE DEVILS**

**MENOMONIE** - For the first game, it looked as if the 16th ranked UW-Stout volleyball team was going to run 13th ranked La Crosse out of Johnson Fieldhouse.But the Eagles turned the tide on the Blue Devils and shut down Stout the rest of the way in a battle of nationally ranked teams, Friday, Sept. 17 in Menomonie. The Eagles took the match, 17-30, 30-17, 30-24, 30-26. Stout (9-2, 1-1 WIAC) could do little wrong in the first match as they manhandled the Eagles (9-2, 1-1) by putting down 15 kills and holding La Crosse to seven, as the Eagles hitting percentage was in the negative range. La Crosse powered back and kept the Blue Devils the rest of the night, although the fourth match was only separated by a point up until La Crosse shot out to a 26-19 lead. Stout got 18 kills from **Brooke Viegut (Sr, Abbotsford)** and 12 from **Tanille Hartwig (Sr, Athens**). The Eagles were led by Laura Wagner with 15 and Lindsey Johnson with 12.

# **16th RANKED BLUE DEVILS DOWN SPUNKY BLUGOLDS IN THREE GAMES**

**EAU CLAIRE** - The match may have been won by a 3-0 margin, but the individual games show a much closer battle as UW-Stout defeated UW-Eau Claire, 30-25, 31-29, 30-28, Wednesday, Sept. 15 in Eau Claire to open Wisconsin Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (WIAC) play for both teams. Stout (9-1, 1-0 WIAC), which moved up one spot in the latest AVCA Division III poll released today, got 17 kills from **Tanille Hartwig (Sr, Athens)** and needed every one of those kills to dispatch the Blugolds (7-3, 0-1). **Kjersti Hamlin (Sr, Spring Valley, Minn)** added 12 kills, while **Lindsay Mensink (Sr, Ostrander, Minn)** had 11 and **Brooke Viegut (Sr, Abbotsford)** 10. Libero **Rachel Linbo (Jr, Stewartville, Minn)**, who returned after missing four games at the Augsburg Invitational due to an injury, led the defensive play with 17 digs. Hartwig had a solo block and four assisted blocks, while Viegut had three assisted blocks.

# NICK OHMAN GARNERS FOOTBALL CONFERENCE, NATIONAL HONORS

**MENOMONIE** - After leading his team to a 23-0 win at DePauw University, Sept. 11, UW-Stout quarterback **Nick Ohman (Sr, Glenwood City)** has been named the Wisconsin Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (WIAC) player of the week and to the Don Hansen National Weekly Football Gazette team of the week. Ohman ran 19 times for a game-high 116 rushing yards and completed 23-of-30 passes for a game-high 216 yards. Ohman led scoring drives of 94 yards, 92 yards, 49 yards and 54 yards. He threw for two touchdowns and ran for another. Ohman tallied 332 yards of total offense as Stout rolled up 416 total yards.

# FORMER CROSS COUNTRY/TRACK RUNNER RELAYS EXPERIENCES IN IRAQ

Before joining the National Guard, the enlistee has to be aware that you can be called up for duty at anytime. For one University of Wisconsin-Stout senior, the call of duty came less than a semester before graduation. On March 15, 2003, **Jason Kirch**, a cross country and track runner, was activated along with the rest of the approximately 500 soldiers that made up the 724th Engineer Battalion. Kirch's unit was based out of Medford. Kirch, who had enlisted in June, 2001, flew overseas on May 9, 2003, one day before he had originally expected to graduate from the university. Following a month long stint in Kuwait, Kirch's battalion made a permanent base in Tallil, Iraq. Tallil is nearly 200 miles southeast of Baghdad, and the city is mostly inhabited by Shittes, anti-Saddam Hussein Muslims. Nearly 8000 soldiers from the US and other coalition forces were stationed at Tallil. Being stationed in a predominant Shiite town, none of the soldiers ever had to fire a weapon in combat. Instead they got along well with the citizens, Kirch said.

"The people were really nice to us," Kirch said. "The biggest thing the kids would say is, 'Mister, mister friend.'"

Besides bringing security to Tallil, the troops rebuilt the city. "I feel like we did more humanitarian aid work than anything else," said Kirch. "Outside the base, we fixed schools, roads, and dug ditches. We also cleared up old mines and old ammunition." Kirch and his fellow troops also built the base in Tallil. "Inside the one-mile perimeter," Kirch said, "we pretty much built everything." He explained how they had to make the most of the buildings, make or repair roads and clean up the debris from shot-up planes and bunkers. Kirch said a major battle occurred before his battalion arrived. He noted the news surrounding Jessica Lynch occurred nearby.

During his free time, Kirch would stay in shape by running. However, it wasn't the same as running with a team like in college. So when he saw other soldiers running, he decided to start a running club. Word spread about the running team, and the 130th Engineers invited them to run in the Anaconda Ten-Miler in Balad, Iraq. The race featured 2,000 American soldiers, and Kirch took an impressive fourth place. Since then, Kirch has run in other military sponsored races. His best time for a ten-mile race is 59:37, which means he averaged less than six-minute miles. In October, he will run in the Chicago Marathon and the Army Ten-Miler in Washington D.C.

Kirch, a Sauk City native, returned home in March, 2004, and is now back at Stout to finish his degree in construction. Helping himself stay in shape for his upcoming races, he practices with his old teammates and also does some limited coaching.

Josh Buchholtz, the Stout men's cross country coach, said, "He is helping us out where and when he can. Plus he is staying in shape while doing it." Kirch is happy to be back in school and finishing a chapter of his life that he expected to close a year and a half ago. However, Kirch has a feeling he hasn't seen the last of Iraq. "It is a good possibility that I will go back before my time in the guard is up," Kirch said. "If the U.S. pulls out now, all the militants will go in and overrule the new government." Whether Kirch goes back or not, Buchholtz and the rest of the cross country and track teams support him. "We support our troops, and we are proud to have him fight for us," Buchholtz said.
