UP THIS WEEK

The Blue Devils (5-0, 0-0), after five non-conference wins, get to the real test this week when they open their conference schedule by traveling to UW-Eau Claire (4-1, 0-0) Wednesday, Nov. 29. Stout will be at UW-Platteville (4-1), Saturday, Dec. 2. Stout took two from Eau Claire last year, winning 82-62 in Menomonie in November and 67-54 at Eau Claire in January. The Blue Devils split with the Pioneers last season, losing their only home game of the season, 63-54, to Platteville in December, but coming back for a 61-52 win in Platteville. Both games are scheduled to be broadcast on WMEQ 880-AM radio and webcast at www.wmeq.com Last week: Stout defeated Northwestern College, 89-45, in the home opener, Nov. 21, then swept past St. Scholastica, 78-51, Nov. 25 and Northland College, 82-62, Nov. 26. Eau Claire defeated St. Norbert, 63-55, Nov. 21, then won their own Thanksgiving Tournament, defeating Otterbein, 76-67, and Morningside, 74-65. The Pioneers went 2-1 on the week, defeating Augustana, 73-56, Nov. 20, then falling in the first round of the Mississippi Challenge in Dubuque, Iowa, to Dubuque, 71-62, but winning the consolation game, 70-63 over Loras. The Blue Devils (2-0, 0-0) will open their conference and home schedule this week by hosting UW-Eau Claire (2-1, 0-0) Wednesday, Nov. 29 at 7 p.m. Stout takes to the road Saturday, Dec. 2 to take on UW-Platteville (4-0, 0-0). Stout swept past Eau Claire last year, downing the Blugolds, 72-35, at Zorn Arena in November, then won 59-47 at Johnson Fieldhouse in January. Stout also swept Platteville, winning 56-50, in Menomonie in December and needing overtime for a 78-73 win at Platteville in January. The Blue Devils (7-1-1, 2-0-0 NCHA, 2-0-0 WIAC) return to conference play this week and will have their hands full by hosting unbeaten and second ranked St. Norbert College (10-0-1, 4-0-0 NCHA), Friday, Dec. 1 at 7:30 p.m. Stout will host Lake Forest College (2-7-1, 0-3-1 NCHA), Saturday, Dec. 2 at 6 p.m. St. Norbert took three games over the Blue Devils last season, a 4-0 decision in December, a 5-1 decision in January and a 7-2 decision in the second round of the NCHA playoffs in February. The Blue Devils have not beaten St. Norbert since Feb. 8, 1970, but did tie the Knights, 4-4, Feb. 7, 2004. Stout split last season with Lake Forest, winning 4-3 on the Foresters' home ice in December, but falling in Menomonie, 5-3, in January. BLUE DEVIL WOMEN RUN PAST NORTHLAND COLLEGE, 82-62

ASHLAND (November 26, 2006) - UW-Stout concluded their Thanksgiving tour of the Lake Superior shoreline with an 82-62 romp over Northland College Sunday. A day after having their hands full in a 12-point win over St. Scholastica, the Blue Devils (5-0) had little trouble with the Lumberjills (0-3), holding as much as a 29 point lead in the game. The Blue Devils, shot 50 percent for the game (33-66) and 52 percent in the first half to jump out to a 47-30 halftime lead, were led by Kelsey Duoss (Sr, Janesville) and Joanna Bird (Jr, Boyceville) with 13 points apiece. Duoss pulled down nine rebounds and Bird was 3-for-5 from 3-point range. Julia Hirssig (Fr, Rochester, Minn) added 12 points and matched Duoss' nine rebounds. Stout held a commanding 60-37 lead in rebounds. The Lumberjills got 19 points from Lindsey Hamm and Jessica Graham and 13 points from Melissa Waytashek. Stout will be at UW-Eau Claire, Wednesday, Nov. 29, then will be at UW-Platteville, Saturday, Dec. 2.

ST. SCHOLASTICA GIVE BLUE DEVILS A GAME

DULUTH, Minn. (November 25, 2006) - St. Scholastica came back from a 12-point first half deficit to pull to within three points, but backto-back jumpers by **Savanah Oeltjen (Sr, Spring Valley, Minn)** extended the UW-Stout lead to seven points and the Blue Devils never trailed again in a 70-58 win Saturday at Reif Recreation Center. But the Saints (2-2) continued to pester the ninth ranked Blue Devils (4-0) all afternoon as Stout picked up their toughest win of the young season. After Stout built a 34-24 halftime lead and carried an 11-point lead in the second half, the Saints again cut the lead to as little as five points several times, the latest a 49-44 Stout lead with just under nine minutes to play. **Joanna Bird (Jr, Boyceville)** connected on back-to-back 3-pointers to give Stout a 56-44 lead and a pair of **Kelsey Duoss (Sr, Janesville)** jumpers kept Stout in double digits, a point spread they would not give up. Duoss led all scorers with 15 points, hitting 7-of-10 shots from the floor. She also had a team-high eight rebounds. Bird had 11 points and **Jenny McDermid (Sr, Oconto Falls)** finished with 10 points. Jesse Stenberg led the Saints with 13 points and Heather Saralampi had 10 points. For the first time this season, Stout did not have a dominating game on boards, collecting 47 rebounds to the Saints' 44. Katie Cross had 13 rebounds for St. Scholastica.

KELSEY DUOSS GETS DOUBLE-DOUBLE AND 1000TH CAREER POINT

MENOMONIE (November 21, 2006) - The UW-Stout women's basketball team played very tight in the first several minutes of their home opener with Northwestern College, Tuesday. The Blue Devils' preseason All-American **Kelsey Duoss (Sr, Janesville)** was in pursuit of her 1000th career point. She only needed two points to reach the milestone, but two turnovers, a missed jumper or two in the lane and a foul were all the statistics Duoss could muster in the first three minutes of the game. Duoss was fouled at the 17:03 mark and, as signs in the stands looking for Duoss to score waved, the senior captain calmly stepped to the line, took a couple of breaths and drained both free throw attempts to push Stout to a 5-5 tie. The entire Blue Devil team loosened up. **Lindsey Gerber (So, Exeland)** popped a 3-pointer for an 8-5 lead, and it was off to the races, as Stout went on an 8-0 run and raced off to an 89-45 win over the Eagles. This one was well over by halftime as Stout (3-0) took a 49-20 lead into intermission. Stout was able to clear their 20-member bench, and all but three players scored. Duoss finished the night with a double-double, scoring a season-low 17 points, but a matched a season-high 11 points in only 15 minutes of game time. **Joanna Bird (Jr, Boyceville)** racked up 13 points, draining three 3-pointers. **Julia Hirssig (Fr, Rochester, Minn)** averaged a point-a-minute, finishing the night with 10 points. The Eagles (0-3) were led for the third straight game by Jen Adamson, who scored 16 points. Stout held a very comfortable lead off the boards, pulling down 52 rebounds to 28 for Northwestern.

KELSEY DUOSS GARNERS PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS

MENOMONIE (November 21, 2006) - UW-Stout forward **Kelsey Duoss (Sr, Janesville/Clinton)** was the most valuable player at the Kilgour (Carroll College) Tournament and was named the women's basketball player of the week by the Wisconsin Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (WIAC) for efforts in leading the Blue Devils to the tournament title. Duoss played nearly identical games - at least statistically-wise - in leading Stout to the championship of the tournament November 18 in Waukesha. Duoss, scored 21 points and pulled down nine rebounds in an 86-60 season opening win over Benedictine, III, University, Nov. 17, then backed that up with a 21 point, 11 rebound performance the following afternoon in a 70-50 win over Edgewood College in the championship game. Against Benedictine, Duoss shot 7-for-14 from the floor and 7-for-8 from the line, with four offensive rebounds, five defensive rebounds, two blocked shots and one steal. Against Edgewood, Duoss shot 8-of-13 from the floor, 5-of-7 from the line, had two offensive boards, nine defensive rebounds, one assist and four blocked shots. Duoss, who transferred to Stout after her freshman season, now has 998 career points at Stout. The Blue Devils host Northwestern College, Tuesday, Nov. 21. This is the sixth time in her career Duoss has been named the WIAC player of the week.

BLUE DEVIL MEN'S BASKETBALL STAYS PERFECT WITH WIN OVER NORTHLAND

ASHLAND (November 26, 2006) - Last season, an experienced UW-Stout basketball team struggled with a winless Northland College before beating the Lumberjacks by five points at Johnson Fieldhouse. That was not the case Sunday as what has been called an inexperienced Blue Devil team had little trouble with previously undefeated Northland, taking a 78-51 win on the Lumberjacks home floor. Jacob Nonemacher (Sr, Kalispell, Mont) led all scorers with 18 points, 10 rebounds and four blocked shots. Jerrel Enerson-Matthews (Fr, Anoka, Minn) continued a hot hand with 17 points. John Nonemacher (Sr, Kalispell, Mont) finished with 14 points for the Blue Devils (2-0). Stout was hot from the floor in the first half, shooting at a 64.3 percent clip (18-28) and cooled down only slightly in the second half, hitting 58.5 percent for the game (31-53). Stout carried a 41-25 lead into halftime. Aaron Arneson led Northland (2-1) with 19 points and Ryan Cannata had 12 points. Stout will host UW-Eau Claire, Wednesday, Nov. 29 at 7 p.m., then will be at UW-Platteville, Saturday, Dec. 2.

BLUE DEVIL MEN ROLL PAST DIVISION II BEMIDJI STATE, 67-49

BEMIDJI, Minn (November 21, 2006) - Jerrel Enerson-Matthews (Fr, Anoka, Minn) scored 23 points as UW-Stout rolled over NCAA Division II Bemidji State, 67-49, Tuesday. Enerson-Matthews was limited to five points in the first half, but lit up the Beavers (0-3) for 18 second half points in the Blue Devils' season opener. Eric Heisler (Jr, Savage, Minn) tossed in 16 points and Jacob Nonemacher (Sr, Kalispel, Mont) contributed 14 points and had 12 rebounds by the end of the first half. Only six Blue Devils scored in this contest. Jason Clopton (Sr, Brooklyn Park, Minn) had seven points, Joshua Huettl (Fr, Eau Claire) had six points and John Nonemacher (Sr, Kalispell, Mont) finished with one point.

BLUE DEVIL HOCKEY REBOUNDS WITH COMEBACK WIN

MILWAUKEE (November 26, 2006) - UW-Stout has had a fair amount of trouble with Gustavus Adolphus over the years, but this year late rallies have kept the Blue Devils undefeated against the Gusties in two tries. The Blue Devils needed two third period goals to notch a 4-3 win over Gustavus in the consolation game of the MSOE Thanksgiving Tournament Sunday at Kern Center. Adam Boche (Sr, South St. Paul, Minn) got the game-winner, his second goal of the day, seven minutes into the third period on the power play. Five minutes earlier, Andy Wiesner (Sr, Rochester, Minn) had tied the game at 3-all. Stout (7-1-1) took an early lead in this contest, with Jeff Wheeler (So, Bainbridge, Wash) scoring his first goal of the season three minutes into the game. Boche put Stout outfront, 2-0, in the seventh minute. Wheeler also scored an assist on the game winning goal. Gustavus (2-6-1) got on the board midway through the first period when Jon Keseley scored on the power play. The Gusties' Eric Bigham and Niko Suoiraniemi each scored in the second period to put Gustavus out to 3-2 lead. Mike Stone (Jr, West St. Paul, Minn) picked up the win for the Blue Devils, coming on in the third period to record five saves and shut the Gusties out. Matt Koenig (So, Lakeland, Minn) worked the first two periods with 10 saves. The Blue Devils outshot Gustavus, 31-18, with John Paszkiewicz making 27 saves. Earlier in the season, Stout forged a 6-6 tie with Gustavus when the Blue Devils scored three goals in the final two minutes of regulation.

STOUT TAKES 3-0 LEAD, FALLS TO NEUMANN, 4-3, FOR SEASON'S FIRST LOSS

MILWAUKEE (November 25, 2006) - UW-Stout jumped out to a 3-0 first period lead, but allowed three unanswered goals, three in the second period, to suffer their first loss of the season, a 4-3 decision to No. 12 Neumann College in the opening game of the Milwaukee School of Engineering Thanksgiving Tournament Saturday. After Stout roared out to the 3-0 first period lead, Neumann picked up three power play goals in the second period to knot the score at 3-all. Neumann got the game winner, again on the power play, with only 12 second remaining in the game. The Blue Devils (6-1-1) came out on fire and looked like they would extend the unbeaten streak to eight games. **Jake Erickson** (**Jr**, **Rochester**, **Minn**) scored seven minutes into the game on the power play, then **Scott Motz (Fr, Lake Elmo, Minn)** added two goals to build up Stout's lead. Motz had assisted on Erickson's goal, and Erickson returned the favor on Motz's first goal. **Andy Wiesner (Sr, Rochester, Minn)** assisted on the first two goals of the game, and **Derek Hanson (Fr, Bemidji, Minn)** assisted on Motz's final goal. But the 10th ranked Blue Devils self-destructed, picking up six second period penalties and were outshot, 20-5, in the second stanza. The Knights' Mike Hedden put 12th ranked Neumann (6-1-2) on the board midway through the period. Neil Trimm cut the lead to one goal at the 14 mintue mark and Matt Ward tied the contest with three minutes left in the period. Hedden would eliminate any thought of overtime, taking a pass from Trimm with 12 second remaining and Stout entered the loss column for the first time this season. **Mike Stone (Jr, West St. Paul, Minn)** recorded 28 saves, while Neumann's Mike Collichio had 19 saves. Stout finished with 10 penalties for 31 minutes, while the Knights' had eight penalties for 16 minutes. Stout was 1-for-7 on the power play, and Neumann was 4-for-10 on the power play. The game marked the first time this season Stout has been outshot (32-22).

WIESNER NETS NCHA, WIAC PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS

MENOMONIE (November 21, 2006) - UW-Stout forward **Andy Wiesner (Sr, Rochester, Minn/Marshall)** scored the game-winning goal and added two assists over the weekend and was named the Northern Collegiate Hockey Association (NCHA) and Wisconsin Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (WIAC) player of the week honors for his efforts. Wiesner scored the game-winning goal with a wicked backhand, unassisted shot with five minutes left in the game to lift the Devils to a 2-1 come-from-behind win over UW-Eau Claire Saturday, Nov. 18, to remain unbeaten on the season. In a 6-2 win over UW-Stevens Point Friday, Nov. 17, Wiesner added two assists, including a pass early in the game for Stout's first goal to tie the game. Wiesner also had an assist midway through the second period on a power play goal.
