FOOTBALL COACHES GIVEN TWO YEAR CONTRACTS

MENOMONIE (August 3, 2007) - UW-Stout head football coach Duey Naatz, along with assistant football coaches Sean Hoolihan, Clayt Birmingham and Dan McCarty, were granted two year contract extensions, University officials said. Naatz was an assistant at Stout for 17 years before assuming the head coaching responsibilities in January. He has been the assistant head coach, offensive coordinator, offensive line coach and defensive backs coach. In addition, Naatz, who came to Stout in 1990, has been the athletic department's strength and conditioning coordinator and facilities coordinator, in addition to teaching in the physical education department. Naatz elevated quarterback coach Hoolihan to offensive coordinator and added Birmingham as defensive coordinator and McCarty as offensive line coach. Hoolihan, a Spring Valley native, was the quarterbacks coach for the past two seasons, following a successful football career in the WIAC with UW-Eau Claire. Birmingham and McCarty both hail from the Door County area, but arrived at Stout through different routes. Birmingham, who was an assistant coach for the USA national team this summer and played collegiately at UW-Stevens Point, has coached at the Division I, II, and III levels and most recently was at Division II Emporia State in Kansas. McCarty, following a football career at UW-Eau Claire, played and coached professional teams in both Europe and the United States. Most recently, McCarty coached in the Sturgeon Bay school district.

CLAYT BIRMINGHAM COACHES NATIONAL TEAM

MENOMONIE (July 12, 2007) - Three former Wisconsin Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (WIAC) student-athletes, one former WIAC head coach and one current WIAC assistant coach participate in the World Championship of American Football, July 7-15 in Kawasaki, Japan, as the USA defeated host Japan for the tournament title. UW-La Crosse's Steve Teeples, UW-Stevens Point's Cody Childs and UW-Whitewater's Ryan Kleppe are three of 45 players named to the team. Former Warhawk head coach Bob Berezowitz will serve as a member of the coaching staff for the squad. Current UW-Stout defensive coordinator Clayt Birmingham will serve as the linebackers coach. The 45 players were selected from a pool of college seniors and represent all levels of college football. The Team USA coaching staff made the final roster selections through film evaluation. Former Kansas City Chiefs and Illinois, Arizona and Texas coach John Mackovic will serve as head coach of the squad. The team has nine Division III players, 25 Division I individuals, 10 Division II athletes and one NAIA player. The United States team will take on five other countries in the event staged by the International Federation of American Football. Team USA will face Germany and Korea in pool play, while the other pool features two-time defending champion Japan along with Sweden and France. The team trained at San Jose State University from June 20-July 4 prior to departure.

The USA team defeated Korea, 77-0, in their first game, and advanced to the championship game with a 33-7 win over Germany. USA defeated Japan, 23-20, in double overtime. That game will be broadcast on the NFL Network, Saturday, July 28 at noon, central time.

COACH EDDIE ANDRIST ANNOUNCES MEN'S BASKETBALL RECRUITING CLASS

MENOMONIE (August 1, 2007) - UW-Stout men's basketball coach Eddie Andrist filled out his 2007-08 recruiting class with transfers that will be coming in as freshmen, sophomores, juniors and seniors and also added several true freshmen to the mix as the Blue Devil introduce a class that is heavy in back court players. Of the eight players listed by Andrist, two come directly to Stout from high school, five of them come in as guards, two as forwards and one as a 7-foot, 1-inch center who began his collegiate career at Stout.

Jesse Piehl (Jr, Tripoli, Iowa) was one of three 7-foot players on the Stout roster when he came to Menomonie three years ago. Piehl sat out his first year, then saw limited action during his freshman season. He transferred to Gogebic Community College last season and returns to Stout as a junior. "Jesse gained some valuable experience at Gogebic Community College," said Andrist. "We truly believe that he is ready to step in and contribute during the rigors of a tough WIAC schedule. He gives us back some valuable height that we lost with the graduation of 7-footers John and Jake Nonemacher."

The Blue Devils were thin in guards last season, but this recruiting class overflows with talented guards.

Miles Webb (Sr, Brooklyn Park, Minn) took a western path before finding his way to Menomonie. After becoming the all-time leading scorer at Brooklyn Park, Minn, Center High School, Webb began his collegiate career at the University of Minnesota. He transferred to North Dakota State College of Sciences, a two-year junior college, where he led NDSCS to the conference title. Webb continued his journey west when he signed with NCAA Division I University of Idaho last season, starting one game for the Vandals and twice scoring 18 points against Division I competition. Webb breaks tradition and moves east and closer to home with the Blue Devils, where he plans to pursue a degree in psychology. "I cannot tell everyone enough how excited we are having Miles join our Blue Devil basketball family," said Andrist. "A player of Miles stature and ability can certainly lead us back to the NCAA tournament."

"Having played Big Ten basketball and being recruited by some of the top NCAA Division I programs across the country gives you an idea of what Miles Webb brings to the table," said assistant coach Lionel Jones, who coached Webb in high school. "He is a pure scorer with the ability to beat you in so many different ways. He is one of the best pure shooters that I have seen at any level."

Jarrad Knutson (Fr, Glenville, Minn) holds the majority of the scoring records at his Glenville-Emmons High School. Knutson averaged 23.3 points last season and set the school individual scoring record (41 points), the single season scoring record (632) and the all-time school scoring record (1568). Knutson averaged 11.6 rebounds per game last season, and is capable of scoring both inside and outside. "Jarrad is easily one of the more versatile athletes that we will bring to the Blue Devil program this fall," Andrist said. "He is a scorer and a shooter and has the body size to defend inside and the quickness to defend outside."

Jamal Khan (So, Maple Grove, Minn) comes from Park Center High School where he averaged 16 points and seven assists per game, while shooting 46 percent from the three-point line. Khan, an honorable mention all-state pick, set the school single season assist record (206), breaking a record held by former Blue Devil guard Jason Clopton. Khan once recorded 16 assists in a single game. Alex Mason (So, St. Paul, Minn), a Humboldt High School graduate, has WIAC point guard written all over himself, Andrist said. After scoring more than 1000 high school points, 400 assists and 102 steals, Mason moved on to Mesabi Community College where he earned all-conference honors in leading the team in steals and assists. Mason also scored 43 points in a single game. "Having watched Alex play at Mesabi, my immediate evaluation projected him as a WIAC point guard," Andrist said. "He has great court vision and will make everyone better on our team."

Jerrod Buchholtz (Fr, Durand) was actually at Stout during the winter semester, but did not play basketball. After spending one semester at Viterbo University, Buchholtz transferred. At Durand High School, Buchholtz averaged 19 points, nine rebounds, five assists and four steals during a senior year that saw him shoot 52 percent from the field, 44 percent from three-point range and 86 percent from the free throw line. "I have always been amazed at how well he shoots the ball," Andrist said. "Jerrod is a true shooter and we certainly could have used him last year."

Forwards and teammates at Iowa Lakes Community College, **Cory Bell (Jr, Brooklyn Park)** and **John Donald (So, Milwaukee)** round out the list. A first team all-conference player, Bell averaged 14 points and nine rebounds as a senior and in one game, pulled down a school record 24 rebounds. At Iowa Lakes last season, Bell averaged 15 points and 11 rebounds and led the league in field goal percentage (.530) and blocked shots (90). Donald played as a freshman at Iowa Lakes, averaging 15 points and six rebounds. Injuries kept him off the hardwood last season. "I first had a look at Cory during his senior year and I was impressed with his rebounding presence on the floor," said Andrist. "He loves to control the glass, block shots and dunk on people. I think that fits very nicely into our strong style of play here. John Donald is another key piece to the puzzle that will get us back to the top of the WIAC," said Andrist. "We really like the view up there and Donald will help put us back on top."

KELSEY DUOSS TO PLAY PROFESSIONALLY IN AUSTRALIA

MENOMONIE (July 18, 2007) - UW-Stout two-time All-American center **Kelsey Duoss (Sr, Janesville/Clinton)** has inked a professional contract and will play in Australia. Duoss, a two-time Wisconsin Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (WIAC) player of the year and three-time all-conference selection, will play for the Dandenong Jayco Rangers and will leave in September for a 24 game schedule that will conclude in February. Dandenong is just east of Melbourne and is located in the southeast province of Victoria of the island continent. The Rangers are a member of the eight team WNBL.

Duoss was twice selected to the first team of the NCAA Division III Kodak All-American squad and to the first team of the D3hoops.com All-American team. Duoss was also a WIAC all-defensive team pick for the third straight year, led the Blue Devils to their third straight WIAC regular season and tournament titles and third consecutive NCAA playoff appearance this year. Duoss led the conference with a .593 field goal percentage and 80 blocked shots, while ranking second with 8.4 rebounds per contest and third with 15.8 points per game. Duoss has posted a league-best eight double-doubles (points-rebounds) and led the team in rebounding in 23 of 29 games and scoring in 22 contests. Her 10 blocked shots against UW-Whitewater on January 27 is the second-highest single-game total in WIAC history. Her 2.8 blocked shots per contest ranked her 17th nationally. Stout finished the season at 23-6 overall, their third consecutive season with 20-plus wins. They also compiled a 13-3 conference record and 12-1 home record.

The Blue Devils have compiled a 69-21 record in Duoss' three seasons and her 258 career blocked shots rank second on the WIAC alltime list. She has registered 1,413 career points and 750 career rebounds – both totals place her second on UW-Stout's all-time charts. Her 457 points this season places her third on the Stout single season scoring list - Duoss's 552 points last season is second - and her 244 rebounds this year places her tied for ninth on the single season rebounding list. A transfer to UW-Stout from Illinois-Chicago after her freshman year, Duoss averaged a 15.9 points per game for her career, 8.4 rebounds per game and 2.9 blocked shots per game. Duoss led the WIAC in scoring during her junior year, averaging 19 points per game. WOMEN'S BASKETBALL 2007-08 RECRUITING CLASS A GOOD FIT

MENOMONIE (July 18, 2007) - When running a program that hasn't had a losing record in nearly two decades, you don't so much rebuild a program as tweak it. After three consecutive WIAC championships and three straight NCAA Division III playoff appearances, UW-Stout coach Mark Thomas and staff went out and recruited a class that, he says, is a good fit with last year's recruiting class.

"This is a real nice class that will fit well with last year's class," said Thomas, who will be entering his 21st year as the Blue Devil coach. "We thought our last year's (recruiting) class was strong. This one fits in well with them and fills some holes.

"We have some nice size and some nice speed and they are all from winning teams."

In a program that is built on speed, the Blue Devils bring in five guards in their eight-member recruiting class and three forwards.

Two of the guards already have sisters on the team. Brittney Gerber (Fr, Exeland) joins sister Lindsey Gerber (Jr, Exeland) and Becky Wyngaard (Fr, Kimberly) joins sister Nikki Wyngaard (Jr, Kimberly). Brittney Gerber, a wing guard, is a two-time all-conference selection from Bruce High School and scored more than 1000 career points. Gerber, who played in the WBCA Division 4 all-star game is termed an excellent shooter by Thomas. "She has deep range and is a smart player," Thomas added. Becky Wyngaard, also a wing guard, has been a leader for the Papermakers and was an all-conference choice. Wyngaard has a good 3-point shot, said Thomas.

Nichole Skillman (Fr, Janesville) comes in as a tall wing guard, tipping the tape at 6-feet tall. An all-conference pick at Janesville Craig, Skillman is a very versatile athlete who earned 11 varsity letters (four in basketball, three in volleyball, two in soccer and two in track) and was named the school's top senior athlete. Thomas said Skillman can score inside and outside and the lanky guard is very fast.

Alex Suda (Fr, Blaine, Minn) and Alisha Todd (Fr, Farmington, Minn), Thomas' only two Minnesota recruits, come to the program as 5-5 point guards. "Alex Suda is a floor general who is very fast and strong," Thomas said about the all-conference performer. "She is a great perimeter defender and competes all out. Alisha Todd is quick and explosive," Thomas said. "She is an excellent shooter and defender." Todd led her conference in both steals and assists.

Tricia Van Vreede (Fr, Little Chute), Shelby Churchill (Fr, Sheboygan) and Kristen Laramy (Fr, Colfax) come in as forwards. Van Vreede, a teammate of Wyngaard at Kimberly High School, is a three-time all-conference selection and an honorable mention all-state pick. Van Vreede played in the Division 1 WBCA all-star game and is "a great athlete, excellent basketball player and strong and physical," Thomas said. Laramy, a two-time all-conference pick, played in the Division 3 WBCA all-star game and came from a program that lost only one game her senior year. A smaller forward, Laramy is a "relentless player who is strong on the boards," Thomas said. "She is a winner coming from a great program." Churchill is listed as both a forward and a center and at 6-foot has "a great low post presence on both ends," Thomas said. An all-conference pick, Churchill's Sheboygan North finished second at the 2007 state tournament in Division 1.

ERIN CHURCHILL TABBED AS WOMEN'S ASSISTANT BASKETBALL COACH

MENOMONIE (August 3, 2007) – Former UW-Stout standout guard Erin Churchill has been named as an assistant women's basketball coach. Churchill, a Plum City native, played for UW-Stout from 2001-05 where she was a two-time all-WIAC honorable mention pick, a four year letterwinner and an integral part when Stout won conference championships in 2002 and 2005. Churchill played in all 112 games she suited up for, which, up to that point, was a school record. Churchill earned a starting role with the Blue Devils during her sophomore season and went on to start 83 games. For her career, Churchill finished with 844 total points (7.5 ppg), 483 rebounds (4.2 rpg) and 383 assists (3.4 apg). Since graduating from Stout early childhood education, Churchill has been pursuing a masters from Stout in family development. She has coached at Eau Claire Regis and in Menomonie School District. In addition to coaching duties, Churchill will also be an instructor in the Physical Education Department.

SCHAUF NAMED COACH OF STOUT COMBINED CROSS COUNTRY PROGRAMS

MENOMONIE (July 10, 2007) - Matt Schauf has been named as head coach for both the UW-Stout men's and women's cross country programs. Schauf comes to the Blue Devils after six seasons (2001-06) as the cross country coach for both boys and girls programs at nearby Boyceville High School. A mathematics teacher in the district's middle school, Schauf calculated the Bulldogs' progressive success. Both programs won the school's first-ever boys and girls conference championships in 2002, then repeated again in 2004. The boys team twice qualified to the WIAA state championships, finishing 12th in 2002 and third in 2004. Schauf was named the District 1 Coach of the Year in 2004. Schauf was also an assistant track coach at Boyceville where he worked with the distance runners from 2002-06. Schauf began his coaching career at Darlington High School where he was an assistant cross country coach. Schauf left Boyceville in 2007 to pursue a masters degree at UW-Stout in Information Communications Technologies and became an assistant track coach for the Blue Devil men's track team, working with the distance runners.

The Stout men's and women's cross country programs were under the auspices of separate coaches, but when women's cross country coach Joe Harlan was named Stout athetic director this summer, the programs were combined. Former men's cross country coach Josh Buchholtz will oversee both the men's and women's track and field programs.

A native of southwestern Wisconsin and a graduate of UW-Platteville, Schauf looks forward to leaving his imprint on the Stout programs. "The challenge of coaching both men and women lies in adequately meeting the needs of so many different individuals," Schauf said. "The key is having leadership among both groups. I believe that it is important to focus on the team and then tailor your training to best meet the needs of the individuals you coach. "We have a very young team, and what I am most concerned with is instilling the values of hard work and commitment, just as coaches Buchholtz and Harlan had."

SAM MAYER FINISHES EIGHTH AT JUNIOR NATIONALS TRACK MEET

INDIANAPOLIS, **Ind** (June 22, 2007) - UW-Stout's **Sam Mayer (Fr, Bloomer)** finished eighth at the 2007 Finish Line USA Junior Outdoor Track & Field Championships in the discus at the Michael A. Carroll Track & Soccer Stadium on the Indiana University - Purdue University Indianapolis (UIPUI) campus Friday. Mayer scored her best mark of the day with her first throw of the day, a distance of 148-feet, 8-inches, her second-best mark of the season. Throwing against predominately unattached performers and performers from NCAA Division I schools, Mayer was second in the first flight, and hung on for the eighth place finish as she fouled twice in the championship round.

STOUT PLACES HIGH IN SEVERAL NCAA BASEBALL CATEGORIES

MENOMONIE (June 7, 2007) - UW-Stout ranked in the top 25 in the NCAA Division III in fielding percentage with the release of the final statistics by the NCAA this week. The Blue Devils ranked 22nd in fielding percentage (.964). Stout committed 54 errors in 1511 chances. Stout had 1034 putouts and 423 assists. During the 2006 season, Stout had a fielding percentage of .931. As a team, the Blue Devils ranked 41st in home runs per game, smacking 28 home runs for a 0.67 home run per game average over 42 games. **Erik Johnson (Jr, La Crosse)** led the team with eight home runs. **Dan Olson (Sr, Eau Claire)** ranked eighth in Division III in strikeouts per game. The senior lefty recorded a team high 53 strikeouts in eight appearances. Over the course of a nine inning game, Olson would have averaged 11 strikeouts. **Ryan Stace (So, Oregon)** tied for 14th in sacrifice hits with 0.30 sacs per game. Stace led the team with 11 sacrifice hits in 37 games. Stout finished the season at 23-19 overall and made their first appearance in the WIAC tournament since 1999.
