RACIBORSKI'S FIELD GOAL LIFTS STOUT TO WIN

MENOMONIE (October 20, 2007) - The clank heard 'round Don & Nona Williams Stadium on Homecoming 2007 was **Brandon Raciborski's (Jr, Eau Claire)** 52-yard field goal attempt hitting the left upright and falling through the goal posts to give UW-Stout a 28-27 win over UW-River Falls Saturday.

In a wild fourth quarter, Stout (3-4, 2-2) took a 25-21 lead after they put together a 13 play, 79 yard drive, capped off by **Andy Reese's (Sr, Lodi)** two-yard run at the 11:46 mark of the final stanza. The Falcons (2-5, 1-3) took the lead back just a bit more than a minute later when they marched 80 yards in four plays, keyed by a 71 yard Storm Harmon to Nate Thoreson pass play to the Blue Devil five yard line. Two plays later Matt Pollock ran in for the score to put River Falls up, 27-25. Stout had a chance to take the lead on the next drive, but a 37 yard field goal went wide. The Blue Devil defense forced a three-and-out and **Shawn Korth (Sr, Marshall)** returned the punt to the Stout 42. A Korth eight yard rush to the 50, a **Tanner Kattre (Sr, Abbotsford)** eight yard pass to **Dan Lytle (Jr, Darien)** to the River Falls 42, a Kattre run to the 35 and two plays for no gain brought Raciborski out on fourth and three with the ball at the 35. The snap from **Mike Bryan (So, Rochester, Minn)** was on target, the hold was Kattre was flawless and the kick by Raciborski looked to be sailing wide left before it hit the goal post about two-thirds up and slid through the posts.

The game-winning field goal overshadowed another good performance by Reese, who ran for three touchdowns and gained 100 yards on 26 carries. Reese had touchdown runs of 20-, 3-, and 2-yards. His 20 yard jaunt at 6:03 in the first put Stout up 6-0 and Kattre ran in for the two-point conversion to give Stout an 8-0 lead. The Falcons took the lead on a 1-yard run by quarterback Harmon with 1:39 left in the first quarter and their 2-point conversion attempt failed. The Blue Devils fumbled the ball away deep in their own territory on the next drive and River Falls capitalized three plays later on a 22-yard pass from Harmon to Ryan Hansen and River Falls led, 13-8.

A 39-yard field goal by **Kyle Martin (So, Hubertus)** with 11:41 on the second quarter clock pulled Stout to within 13-11. After stopping the Falcons, Stout used a 22-yard run by Kattre and a 36-yard run by Korth to set up Reese's three-yard rumble for an 18-13 lead heading into halftime. The Blue Devils offense stalled in the third quarter and River Falls took advantage after Ryan Agrimson picked off Kattre and returned the ball to the Stout four. One play later, Pollock scored his first TD of the game, this one coming midway through the third. A two-point conversion later, and River Falls led 21-18. Stout took the lead early in the fourth when Reese ran for his third TD of the day to begin the wild fourth quarter. Stout tallied 420 yards of total offense to 320 for the Falcons. Kattre rushed for 85 yards, completed 14-of-26 passes for 153 yards and caught two passes for 28 yards. Korth caught five passes for 61 yards and rushed for 44. For the Falcons, Harmon completed 17-of-27 passes for 235 yards and a score. Michael Zweifel had six catches for 73 yards. Nathan Anderson led the Falcons' ground game with 89 yards on 27 totes. Defensively, the Falcons' Bruce Baillargeon finished with 25 tackles, eight solo. Joe Simonson and Agrimson each had an interception. **Jake Pomputis (Jr, Owen)** led Stout with 12 tackles, four solo. **Stephen Schils (Sr, Green Bay)** had an interception, six tackles and was in on one sack.

SCHILS EARNS WIAC PLAYER OF WEEK HONORS

MENOMONIE (October 16, 2007) - UW-Stout linebachelor **Stephen Schils (Sr, Green Bay/Ashwaubenon)** was named the Wisconsin Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (WIAC) defensive player of the week after his performance in Saturday's game with UW-Stevens Point. Schils had two interceptions in Stout's 26-23 loss at UW-Stevens Point. Schils' first pick came on the Pointers' second play from scrimmage and he returned the ball 10 yards to the Stevens Point four. Stout scored on the next play. Schils got his second interception two plays after Stout fumbled the kickoff away deep in their own territory in the second quarter, returning the ball to the Stout 14. Schils finished the day with nine tackles, seven solo and one tackle for a loss. On the season, Schils has three interceptions for 41 yards in returns. He has 45 tackles, 28 solo, six tackles for losses and 1.5 sacks. He also blocked one extra point attempt.

STOUT SOCCER STAYS ON WINNING TRACK, DOWN CARDINALS

WINONA, Minn (October 21, 2007) - **Kaitlin Arjes (Fr, Owatonna, Minn)** put an end to St. Mary's 23-game non-conference winning streak when the UW-Stout forward scored the game winner with about 16 minutes left to play to give Stout a 2-1 win over the Cardinals Sunday at Ochrymowycz Field. Arjes took a pass from **Harper Giese (Fr, Winona, Minn)** that she buried home as Stout (6-10-0) overcame a 1-0 halftime deficit. St. Mary's (9-7-0) peppered the Stout goal in the first half, but **Jessica Halverson (Jr, Delano, Minn)** turned away five shots. The Cardinals' Amy Sibik scored to give St. Mary's the 1-0 lead when her header hit the crossbar and fell in. The Blue Devil defense tightened in the second half, allowing only one second half shot on goal as Stout evened the score 13 minutes into the second stanza when **Michelle Hahn (Fr, Hartford)**, assisted by **Michelle Lizotte (Sr, Racine)**, scored. Halverson finished the day with six saves, while St. Mary's goalie Marianna Sanchez had five saves. In total shots, St. Mary's outshot Stout, 18-15. With the win, Stout has won four of their last five games.

BLUE DEVILS WIN A WET ONE AT RIVER FALLS

RIVER FALLS (October 17, 2007) - Over the past week, UW-Stout's **Rachel Herzog (Jr, Owatonna, Minn)** has been putting her name out there. Coming into the season, Herzog had no career goals and she carried that through the middle of this season. Herzog scored her second goal in as many games, getting the only goal of the first half and Stout went on to a 3-1 win at UW-River Falls Wednesday on a warm, wet and breezy afternoon. Herzog scored unassisted in the ninth minute of the game from about 15 feet out. **Michelle Lizotte (Sr, Racine)** would get what would prove to be the game winning goal for the Blue Devils (5-10-0, 3-4-0) in the 60th minute on an assist by **Jessica Price (Fr, Woodbury, Minn)**. The Falcons (2-11-3, 1-3-2) cut the lead in half when Kelly Piersak scored in the 77th minute. Price got into the scoring act later in the game when she put took a cross from **Michelle Hahn (Fr, Hartford)** in the 89th minute and headed the ball into the goal. The Blue Devils pretty much controlled the field, outshooting the Falcons, 17-9. Stout put 12 shots on goal to eight for River Falls. Stout's **Jessica Halvorson (Jr, Delano, Minn)** had seven saves, including a save late in the game when the score was 2-1. The Falcons' Jen Taylor put a shot on goal from about 18 feet out and Halvorson tipped the ball up and over the crossbar to preserve the lead. Emily Stieler had nine saves for the Falcons.

BLUE DEVIL VOLLEYBALL STAYS WITH FOURTH RANKED TITANS

MENOMONIE (October 20, 2007) - By watching the match, a spectator would have a hard time determining which team had a sub-.500 record and which team was ranked fourth in the country. Even the uniforms looked very similar as UW-Oshkosh (27-3, 6-1) defeated UW-Stout (10-15, 1-7), 3-1, but all of the games were close - with the exception of the one game the Titans won. The Titans survived for a 30-26, 18-30, 32-30, 30-27 win. Oshkosh continually shot themselves in the foot, especially at the service line where they committed 24 service errors. The Titans also committed 35 hitting errors, and finished the day hitting only .106. But it wasn't all Oshkosh hurting themselves. Stout took advantage of Oshkosh mistakes and stayed close with the fourth ranked Titans throughout the match. **Linda Meyer (Sr, Cedarburg)** finished the game with 15 kills for Stout and **Maggie Meixl (Jr, Mankato, Minn)** had 10 kills. Meixl was impressive at the defensive net, scoring five solo blocks and one assisted block. **Casey Huntoon (Sr, Mantorville, Minn)** tallied 30 digs for the Blue Devils and, in the process, set a school record for digs in a single season. Huntoon currently has 538 digs and broke the school record of 536 by Monica Cyrus from 1998. The Titans' Kim Vail matched Meyers with 15 kills and Jacque Ray added 10.

Stout will close out the regular season, Saturday, Oct. 27 when they travel to Stevens Point to face the Pointers in a non-conference contest and the Milwaukee School of Engineering.

BLUE DEVILS HANG WITH TOP 10 WARHAWKS

MENOMONIE (October 19, 2007) - That UW-Whitewater defeated UW-Stout 3-0 does not show how close this match really was. For two games, Stout (10-14, 1-6) stayed with the eighth ranked Warhawks (22-4, 6-0), losing the first two, 30-25 and 31-29, before Whitewater took over in the third and cruised to a 30-18 win. **Maggie Meixl (Jr, Mankato, Minn)** led the Blue Devils with nine kills. **Bridget Kelly (Jr, Dodge Center, Minn)** and **Steph Nichols (Fr, Greendale)** each tallied seven. **Casey Huntoon (Sr, Mantorville, Minn)** led the team with 23 digs, followed by **Jenna Welsh (Sr, Abbotsford)**, who finished with 11. Welsh also added a team-high 32 assists. Sarah Theis led the Warhawks with nine kills. Kate Lazotte finished with all 35 of Whitewater's assists. Kelly Sorenson and Kristina Conlin both cracked double digits in digs with 15 and 13, respectively.

SCHOLASTICA BEATS STOUT FOR SECOND TIME

DULUTH, Minn (October 16, 2007) - UW-Stout took the first game, but St. Scholastica rallied back to take the next three games as the Saints defeated Stout for the second time this season. The first game was tied at 19 apiece, before the Blue Devils (10-13) pulled away for a 30-22 win. The Saints (13-14) went on to win the final three games, 30-21, 30-13, 30-23. Stout had lost 3-2 to St. Scholastica early in the season at the Bridge Tournament hosted by the Saints in September. Stout's **Maggie Meixl (Jr, Mankato, Minn)** led all players with 17 kills. **Linda Meyer (Sr, Cedarburg)** and **Jenna Swanson (So, Hayfield, Minn)** both finished with 11 kills. The Saints got 16 kills from Amy Thompson, 12 from Shawn Varichak and 10 from Dustie Richardson.

CZECH FINISHES SECOND AT WIAC TENNIS CHAMPIONSHIPS

MADISON (October 21, 2007) - UW-Stout's **Jodie Czech (Jr, Foley, Minn)** finished second at No. 2 singles at the WIAC Tennis Championships Sunday at the Nielsen Tennis Stadium in Madison. Czech entered the tournament as the second seed at No. 2 singles, and matched the seed. She opened the tournament with a 6-1, 6-2, win over seventh seeded Emily Riordan of UW-Stevens Point. She then had to come back after dropping the first set to down third seeded Jessie Farrar of UW-Whitewater, 3-6, 6-3, 6-4. She lost to fourth seeded Gina Dahl of UW-Eau Claire in the championship round, 6-4, 6-2. The runner-up finish was Czech's highest career placing in the tournament. Last season, she was fourth at No. 2 singles and was fourth as a freshman at No. 3 singles. Czech paired with **Lindsey Luberda (So, Champlin, Minn)** at No. 3 doubles, finishing fifth with an 8-6 win over Brit Wagner/Kelly McDonnell of UW-La Crosse.

Michelle Hohl (Sr, Portage) finished up her career with a fourth-place finish at No. 5 singles, matching a fourth place finish last season at No. 3 doubles. The fourth place was her best singles finish. Hohl will graduate in December. **Allie Hinman (Fr, Lino Lake, Minn)** finished fourth at No. 1 singles, winning her first match in straight sets, 6-3, 6-2, against Sarah Riordan of UW-Eau Claire. She fell to eventual champion Kozue Matsumoto of UW-River Falls, 6-1, 6-4, then lost the third place match, 7-5, 4-6, 6-4, against Rachel Benn of UW-Stevens Point, to finish fourth. Hinman and **Natalie Hahn (Sr, Mound, Minn)** finished fifth at No. 1 doubles.

As a team, Stout finished sixth in the tournament and fifth overall. The Blue Devils (8-3, 3-3) finished third in the dual meet standings.
