BLUE DEVIL FOOTBALL HANGS ON TO GET ROAD WIN AT LA CROSSE

LA CROSSE (October 27, 2007) - UW-Stout ran out to a 31-7 lead, but had to hang on to their seats as they recorded a 31-28 win over UW-La Crosse Saturday at Veterans Memorial Stadium. Stout (4-4, 3-2) had not won a road game all season and it looked like the Blue Devils had punched their ticket when they scored 24 third quarter points for the 31-7 lead. But the Eagles (3-4, 1-4), who have experienced roller coaster wins and, mostly, losses all season, scored 21 points in the fourth quarter after their number one quarterback left the game. The game came down to the final play of the game with six-tenths of a second left when a Dylan Rude 47 yard field goal attempt to send the game into overtime came up short, and Stout had their first road win of the season.

Stout scored first, using an 11-play, 80 yard drive, with quarterback **Tanner Kattre (Sr, Abbotsford)** getting the one-yard touchdown run at 6:04 in the second quarter. The Eagles tied the game when starting quarterback Griffin Moe used three passes and a Stout pass interference penalty to set up a 12-yard TD toss to Ted Everson with a minute left in the half. The second half turned out to be real interesting as the Blue Devils scored three touchdowns in less than four minutes, all three in only one play each. After the Stout defense held La Crosse on a three-and-out, Kattre connected with Stout's leading receiver, **Shawn Korth (Sr, Marshall)**, for a 45-yard touchdown pass on first down. It was Korth's first touchdown of the year. The Blue Devils took advantage of a fumble forced by **Andy Towner (Jr, Onalaska)** and recovered by **Arinze Ikemefuna (Jr, Bell Canyon, Calif)** at the Stout 39. One play later, Kattre connected with **Calvin White (Fr, Benton Harbor, Mich)** for a 61-yard touchdown pass play. On La Crosse's next series, **Stephen Schils (Sr, Green Bay)** stepped in front of a Moe pass and returned it 25 yards for the score, marking his fifth interception of the season, and Stout led 28-7.

Kyle Martin (So, Hubertus) added a 27-yard field goal with a minute left in the period.

Then it would be La Crosse's turn as Alex Seguin replaced Moe and promptly led the Eagles on 90-yard drive, capped off by a 23-yard touchdown pass to Jason Wagner less than two minutes into the fourth quarter. The Eagles scored on their next drive after recovering a Stout fumble on the Blue Devil 28. Dan Hall ran in from the four yard line. The two-point conversion failed, and Stout's lead was cut to 31-20 with 11:14 left in the game. The Eagles came knocking on the door on their next series as the Eagles completed a 49 yard drive. Hall carried from the four yard line of first-and-goal, but the ball was popped loose, only to be recovered in the end zone by tight end Brian Edminston. After the Blue Devils couldn't get much going and forced to punt, the Eagles got as far as the Stout 24 before the Stout defense stiffened and held. Stout got as far as their own 30 and Martin punted to the La Crosse 35 with a minute left. A Seguin to Wagner 25 pass went to the Stout 30 and that was followed by an incomplete pass, bringing on the field goal team from the 30 and the attempt went short.

The Eagles racked up 489 yards of offense, with 429 yards coming on the pass. Moe completed 71-of-30 passes for 246 yards and a score, while Seguin completed 15-of-23 passes for 183 yards. Each had a touchdown as the Eagles completed 32-of-53 passes. Wagner had 14 catches for 200 yards, while Everson grabbed 11 passes for 135 yards. The Blue Devils finished with 368 total yards, 267 coming by the pass. Kattre completed 12-of-17 passes for 249 yards and two TDs. **Kyle Provos (So, Brooklyn Center, Minn)** was 2-of-4 for 18 yards. Korth had four receptions for 83 yards. Defensively, **Jake Pomputis (Jr, Owen)** led the way for the Blue Devils with 12 tackles, 10 solo, and a 40-yard interception return.

The win kept Stout in the title race. Stout will host UW-Whitewater, which is undefeated in conference play, Saturday, Nov. 3 at 1 p.m.

RACIBORSKI, REESE RECEIVE WIAC HONORS

MENOMONIE (October 23, 2007) - UW-Stout running back **Andy Reese (Sr, Lodi)** and placekicker **Brandon Raciborski (Jr, Eau Claire/Memorial)** were named players of the week by the Wisconsin Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (WIAC) after their part in the Blue Devils' 28-27 win over UW-River Falls Saturday. Reese scored three touchdowns in UW-Stout's 28-27 win over UW-River Falls on Oct. 20. He had touchdown runs of 20-, 3- and 2-yards. Reese had a game-high 100 rushing yards on 26 carries with a long of 20 yards on the touchdown run in the first quarter that gave the Blue Devils a 6-0 advantage. Raciborski kicked a 52-yard field goal with 45 seconds remaining to lift UW-Stout to a 28-27 win over UW-River Falls on Oct. 20. His kick hit the left upright and fell between the goalposts. It was Raciborski's first field goal of the year and the third-longest kick in WIAC history and second-longest in Blue Devil archives.

STOUT VOLLEYBALL DROPS PAIR OF MATCHES AT POINT

STEVENS POINT (October 27, 2007) - By identical 3-1 scores, UW-Stout lost to host UW-Stevens Point and the Milwaukee School of Engineering (MSOE) Saturday in a triangular. Stout (10-17) lost to the Pointers, 30-14, 30-25, 24-30, 30-11, and to MSOE, 33-31, 30-27, 20-30, 30-25. Against the Pointers (23-11), Jenna Swanson (So, Hayfield, Minn) was Stout's kills leader with nine points. The Blue Devils hit at a .012 clip, getting almost as many hitting errors (36) as kills (38). Gina Guell had 15 kills for Stevens Point. Linda Meyer (Sr, Cedarburg) led all scorers in the MSOE (11-18) match, putting down 18 kills. Swanson and Maggie Meixl (Jr, Mankato, Minn) each added 14 kills. Casey Huntoon (Sr, Mantorville, Minn) finished the match with 42 digs. Allie Sowinski had 16 kills for the Engineers.

POINTERS SCORE THREE IN FIRST HALF TO DOWN STOUT SOCCER

MENOMONIE (October 27, 2007) - UW-Stevens Point scored three goals in the first half, but the Stout defense shut the Pointers down in the second half as Stevens Point defeated Stout, 3-0, Saturday at Nelson Field. The Pointers' (13-3-1, 7-1-0) struck early and often as Amanda Prawat scored twice within 34 seconds in the eighth minute. Vicki Bieschke scored in the 40th minute to close out the scoring for the day. While the Pointers outshot Stout, 15-5, on the day, the Blue Devils (6-11-0, 3-5-0) kept the Pointer offense in check, allowing only four total second half shots, two on goal. Stout held a 4-0 lead in corner kicks in the second half. **Katie Thompson (Sr, St. Francis, Minn)** took the loss for the Blue Devils, working the first half and recording three saves. **Jessica Halvorson (Jr, Delano, Minn)** allowed no goals in the second half and stopped two shots.

HOCKEY TEAM SQUEAKS PAST MARIAN COLLEGE

FOND DU LAC (October 27, 2007) - One night after dominating Northland College, UW-Stout needed a late goal to squeak out a 6-5 win over Marian College Saturday. Freshman **David Larson (Warroad, Minn)** scored the game winner unassisted with less than four minutes left in regulation to give Stout (2-0-0) the win. The game, and the first period in particular, was a wild, offensive show. Stout took a 4-3 lead into the first intermission as **Joel Gaulrapp (Fr, Owatonna, Minn)** scored two goals within five minutes of each other in the period. Gaulrapp's second goal gave Stout a 3-1 lead midway through the opening period, but the Sabre (0-1-0) came back with two of their own to knot the score. **Derek Hanson's (So, Bemidji, Minn)** goal with three minutes left in the period gave Stout the 4-3 lead.

Stout never trailed in the game, but they certainly could not put the Sabres away. Demitry Sentsov tied the score for Marian on a power play four minutes into the second, but Stout took a 5-4 lead on **Jared Britton's (Fr, Regina, Sask)** first collegiate goal at the 15:07 mark of the second period. But Marian answered back on a goal by Nick Cinquegrani with less than a minute left in the stanza to tie at 5-5.

Mike Stone (Sr, West St. Paul, Minn) made the start for the Blue Devils in goal, but gave up four goals and gave way to Matt Koenig (Jr, Lakeland, Minn) midway through the second period. Stone finished with 11 saves, while Koenig turned back 18. The Sabres' Cullen Caldwell had 33 saves and absorbed the loss.

MENOMONIE (October 26, 2007) - UW-Stout jumped all over Northland College for five goals in the second period to take a 9-1 win over the Lumberjacks in the season opener for both teams Friday. The Blue Devils took advantage of a five minute major for checking from behind by Northland to score three power play goals within three minutes during the long power play opportunity. While the Blue Devils controlled the zone in the first period, putting 16 shots on goal in the period, they managed only one goal, that coming with four minutes left in the period when **Robert Carr (Fr, Roseau, Minn)** scored his first collegiate goal, with an assist by **Luke Schroeder (Sr, Minneapolis, Minn)**.

The Lumberjacks evened the score only 14 seconds into the second period when Tony Huberty lifted a shot past **Matt Koenig (Jr, Lakeland, Minn)**. Northland, which went winless last season, was thinking upset against the 12th ranked Blue Devils. But **Jeff Wheeler (Jr, Bainbridge, Wash)** quashed those hopes as he scored his first of two goals on the night at 5:46. The Lumberjacks' Matt Tanneberg was called for what would prove to be a very costly penalty. **Joel Gaulrapp (So, Owatonna, Minn)** opened the scoring at 9:16, followed by Wheeler's second goal a minute later. **Scott Motz (So, Lake Elmo, Minn)** completed the trifecta less than two minutes later and Stout found themselves up 5-1. Schroeder added a short handed goal at 17:28. The Blue Devils added three more goals in the final stanza. Gaulrapp picked up his second goal of the evening midway through the period. **Paul Henderson (So, Menomonie)** scored at 15:12 and **Andy Sternberg (So, Duluth, Minn)** finished off the scoring 28 seconds later. Wheeler was credited with assists on Henderson's and Sternberg's goals.

Stout outshot the Lumberjacks, 53-14. Koenig had 11 saves, and gave way to **Glenn Walker (Sr, Verona)**, who turned back two third period shots.
