BLUE DEVIL WOMEN'S BASKETBALL DOWNS OSHKOSH

OSHKOSH (December 8, 2007) - UW-Stout held UW-Oshkosh scoreless for more than nine minutes and the Blue Devils overcame an early deficit, going on to 64-51 win Saturday. The Titans (4-4, 1-2) held a 19-16 lead midway through the first half when the Blue Devils (5-4, 2-1) tightened the defensive screws and took a 28-19 lead with 1:26 left in the half. **Lindsey Geissler (Sr, Thorp)** and **Joanna Bird (Sr, Boyceville)** made back-to-back 3-pointers, **Julia Hirssig (So, Rochester, Minn)** hit a bucket, Geissler added a lay-up and **Megan Maslowski (So, Marshfield)** made a lay-up to push Stout in the 12-0 run. The Titans closed it to 28-23 at halftime. Hirssig scored 10 of her 16 game-high points in the second half and Geissler added eight second half points to finish with 13 points as Stout had as much as a 13 point lead - including the final score - several times in the second half. Geissler went 2-for-3 from the free throw line, missing her first free throw of the season. She is now 30-of-31 for the season. Holding a slim two-point, 40-38, lead, Stout ran off on a 9-0 run to take a 49-38 lead with 8:21 left. Whitney Tyrivier scored 13 points and was Oshkosh's only player in double digits. Bird tallied 10 points for Stout.

Stout will host Finlandia University, Tuesday, Dec. 11 at 7 p.m.

GEISSLER'S BUZZER-BEATER BEATS FALCONS

RIVER FALLS (December 5, 2007) - **Lindsey Geissler (Sr, Thorp)** hit a running layup at the buzzer to give UW-Stout a 67-66 win over UW-River Falls, Wednesday at Karges Center. In a game that looked like a blowout early - Stout led 25-2 at midway through the first half - turned out to be full of drama late. River Falls (2-4, 0-2) overcame the first half deficit to pull to within 39-25 at halftime, then tied the game at 48-48 midway through the second half. Stout 4-4, 1-1) pulled ahead by four, but the Falcons regained the lead and held it until the final second of the game, going ahead by as much as six points with about a minute left. River Falls held a 66-65 lead with 12 seconds left, but blew a chance to go ahead by three when they missed two free throws. Stout worked the ball down court, called timeout with five seconds left, then worked the ball around and Geissler found the lane and the winning bucket. Stout had two players in double figures. **Julia Hirssig (So, Rochester, Minn)** finished with 11 points, eight in the first half, and **Charlee Edwards (Jr, Danbury)** finished with 11 points, all in the first half. Geissler finished the night with five total points, all in the second half. The Falcons got 19 points and eight steals from Jana Benitz, 13 points from Kelli Hilt and 10 points from Caitlin Hunstock. The game was loaded with turnovers. Stout committed 35 turnovers and River Falls committed 27. The Falcons recorded 26 steals, while Stout had 13 steals.

OSHKOSH JUMPS OUT TO EARLY LEAD, DOWNS STOUT MEN

OSHKOSH (December 8, 2007) - UW-Oshkosh jumped out to a 17-point halftime lead and went on to an 81-61 win over UW-Stout Saturday. Stout (3-5, 0-3) never got as close as 17 the rest of the game as four of the Titans' (7-0, 3-0) five starters finished the game in double figures. Dane Seckar-Anderson led the way with 20 points. Greg Schrimpf had 16 points, Matt Miller 14 and Jordan Johnson 10. Johnson had a game-high 12 rebounds. **Jerrel Enerson-Matthews (So, Anoka, Minn)** had 19 points to lead Stout and **John Donald (Jr, Milwaukee)** scored 15 points. Stout's **Miles Webb (Sr, Brooklyn Park, Minn)**, the conference's second leading scorer, was held to six points. Stout shot 40.4 percent (23-of-57) from the floor, while Oshkosh shot 51.9 percent (27-of-52).

Stout will be at NCAA Division II Michigan Tech, Tuesday, Dec. 11 and at Finlandia University, Wednesday, Dec. 12.

STOUT COMES UP SHORT AGAINST RIVER FALLS

MENOMONIE (December 5, 2007) - UW-River Falls made a buzzer-beater to take a two point lead into halftime, and UW-Stout never tied nor led the rest of the game, falling to the Falcons, 79-72, in their second conference loss in two games. Stout's (3-4, 0-2) **Jerrel Enerson-Matthews (So, Anoka, Minn)** came up one rebound shy of a double-double, scoring 16 points and pulling down nine rebounds. He also dished out a game-high six assists. **Miles Webb (Sr, Brooklyn Park, Minn)** led the Blue Devils with 22 points, 20 of which came in the second half, while he added seven rebounds on the night. River Falls (3-4, 1-1) had two men collect double-doubles. Willie Wright scored 13 points and grabbed 13 rebounds, while Nate Robertson scored 12 and finished with 10 boards. Scott Kelly led all Falcons with 16 points.

BLUE DEVIL HOCKEY ROLLS OVER LAKE FOREST

LAKE FOREST, III. (December 8, 2007) - After losing big to first place St. Norbert College the night before, the UW-Stout hockey team took out their frustrations on last place Lake Forest College, taking a lopsided 7-2 win Saturday. The seven goals was the most goals for Stout since a 7-1 win over Hamline in early November. Stout's shots on-net came close to doubling Lake Forest's, 44-25. The Blue Devils (11-2-1, 4-2-0) wasted little time getting on the board. **Danny Ryan, Jr. (Fr, Niles, Ill)** playing near his old stomping grounds, scored only 1-minute, 26 seconds into the game, getting a shorthanded goal. **Luke Schroeder (Sr, Minneapolis, Minn)** scored two minutes later and Stout took a 3-0 lead when **Joel Gaulrapp (So, Owatonna, Minn)** scored on the power play at 12:28. The Foresters (1-11-1, 0-6-0) took advantage of two power play opportunities to pull to within one goal. Justin Taylor scored with three minutes left in the first period and Adam Love scored three minutes into the second period. Schroeder scored his second goal of the night three minutes later and **Derek Hanson (So, Bemidji, Minn)** scored with three minutes left in the period to give Stout a 5-2 lead going into the second intermission. **Paul Henderson (So, Menomonie)** and **Jeff DeFrancesca (Sr, Mount Prospect, Ill)** scored in the third period. **Matt Koenig (Jr, Lakeland, Minn)** picked up the win for Stout, getting 19 saves. **Mike Stone (Sr, West St. Paul, Minn)** worked the final 10 minutes, making four saves.

Stout is off until Friday, Jan. 4 when they host Southern Alberta Institute of Technology in an exhibition game.

ST. NORBERT SCORES FOUR IN SECOND TO DOWN STOUT

GREEN BAY (December 7, 2007) - St. Norbert scored three goals over a four minute time span and four goals in the second period as the Green Knights defeated UW-Stout, 7-1, in a battle of NCHA heavyweights Friday at Cornerstone Community Center. St. Norbert (8-1-1, 4-0-1) added three goals in the third, and Stout (10-2-1, 3-2-0) got their only goal of the game when **Joel Gaulrapp (So, Owatonna, Minn)** scored midway through the final stanza. Starting six minutes into the second period with no score, the Green Knights' Matt Boyd, Brad Herman and Steve Sleep scored in just over four minutes. Six minutes later, the fog horn sounded again as Ryan Petersen closed out the second period scoring. The Knights scored twice in the third before Gaulrapp scored, but Marc Belanger scored his second goal of the period to wrap up the scoring on the evening. St. Norbert outshot the Blue Devils, 33-14. The loss was Stout's most lopsided loss since a 9-0 loss to St. Scholastica on Feb. 4, 2006.

MICHELLE LIZOTTE VOTED SOCCER MVP

MENOMONIE (December 3, 2007) - UW-Stout's forward **Michelle Lizotte (Sr, Racine/Horlick)** was recently named team MVP, as voted on by the rest of the squad, coach Meagan Frank announced recently. Lizotte's season stats back up the decision; she led the team with four goals on 35 shots, four assists, and 12 points, and shared a team-best 16 shots on goal with **Michelle Hahn (Fr, Hartford)**. Lizotte's season earlier earned her a spot on the all-WIAC soccer team.

Other season awards went to **Mone't Morning (Jr, Hayward)** for Most Valuable Defender and **Laura Howard (Jr, Hudson)**, who was named Most Inspirational. The Blue Devils soccer team also recently voted **Kaitlin Arjes (Fr, Owatonna, Minn)** and **Jessica Halverson (Jr, Delano, Minn)** as the team's winter captains.

MEYER, HUNTOON LEAD VOLLEYBALL AWARD WINNERS

MENOMONIE (December 10, 2007) - **Linda Meyer (Sr, Cedarburg/Grafton)** and **Casey Huntoon (Sr, Mantorville, Minn/Byron)** earned the UW-Stout most valuable offensive and defensive volleyball team awards, coach Jill Jolliff announced recently at the team's annual awards banquet. **Maggie Meixl (Jr, Mankato, Minn/West)** was given the team spirit award. Freshman **Stephanie Nichols (Greendale)** was named the most improved and shared the rookie of the year award with **Kim Labat (Fr, Marshall, Minn)**. **Alicia Mizer (So, Barron)** received the hustle award.

Meyer, an outside hitter, led the team in kills with 2.98 k/game. She was second on the team in digs, behind only Huntoon, with 295 total and a 3.47 dig/game average. Meyer finished with 23 service aces and 27 total blocks.

Huntoon - Stout's libero - not only led the team in digs, but she also set the school record for digs in a single season with 607 (6.13 digs/game), easily eclipsing the previous record of 536 put up by Monica Cyrus in 1998. Huntoon, an all-WIAC defensive team selection, led the WIAC in digs by nearly one dig per game. In the Blue Devils' first tournament of the year, Huntoon shattered Barb Carlson and Scooter Aspen's previous record of 40 digs in a match when she dug up 48 against Hamline University. Huntoon earned all-tournament team honors at the Platteville Invitational, totaling 76 digs over 14 games.

Meixl was also named to the all-conference squad. As a middle hitter, Meixl led the team in blocks (0.98 b/g) and was second on the team in kills (241 total, 2.46 k/g). Nichols saw action in 58 games, tallying 1.24 kills/game. Labat played in 77 games, coming in primarily as a serving specialist where she finished second on the team with 29 service aces and a team-high 0.38 service aces per game. She also averaged 2.64 digs/game. Mizer, a defensive specialist, finished with 299 digs, averaging 3.05 digs/game.

SCHILS FOOTBALL TEAM MVP; ESKRIDGE GETS TEAMMATE AWARD

MENOMONIE (December 10, 2007) - Linebacker **Stephen Schils (Sr, Green Bay/Ashwaubenon)** was named the most valuable player of the UW-Stout football team, coach Duey Naatz announced at the team's recent awards program. Defensive back **Wendell Eskridge (Sr, Milwaukee/Custer)** was given the WE-US-OURS Teammate Award, an award chosen by the players. The award personifies a player who puts team above self.

Schils was named the most valuable defensive player. Wide receiver **Shawn Korth (Sr, Marshall)** was given the most valuable offensive player and punter/kicker **Kyle Martin (So, Hubertus/Kettle Moraine Lutheran)** was given the most valuable special teams player award. The program recognized the team's 16 seniors.

Schils was a second team all-WIAC pick and put up impressive numbers this year as one of Stout's linebackers, earning him a spot on the second team defense for the third consecutive year. Schils led the WIAC in interceptions with six, one of which he returned for a touchdown. His 84 tackles put him in sixth place and his 11.5 tackles for a loss ranked him fifth in the league. Schils also added two sacks, two pass break-ups, one fumble recovery and a blocked kick.

Eskridge earned first team all-WIAC defensive honors as a defensive back and was picked to play in the Aztec Bowl, a team made up of NCAA Division III players. The all-star team, which defeated a Mexican all-star team, 37-19, selected Eskridge as a team captain and also as a starter. While playing cornerback for the Blue Devils, he led the team in passes broken up with seven, and his three interceptions trailed only Schils' total of six. Eskridge's 10 total passes defended put him one back of the conference lead. As a kick returner, Eskridge returned 14 kickoffs for 287 yards, averaging 20.5 yards per return. Eskridge was a third team d3football.com all-west region pick.

Korth was a first team all-conference pick as a return specialist, but also excelled this season at the wide receiver position by leading the Blue Devils in receptions, yards, and touchdowns. Korth's kick return average of 20.6 yards per return ranked third in the WIAC. As a receiver, Korth ranked third in yards per game with 70.4 per contest and his 4.4 receptions per game put him in ninth among all WIAC receivers. Korth finished with three touchdowns.

Martin was a key cog in the Blue Devils' special teams, pinning opponents inside the 20 yard line on punts 19 times. Martin punted 58 times for an average of 38.4 yards per punt. Of the 58 punts, only 15 were returned for an average of 7.9 yards per return. Martin was the team's second leading scorer, finishing with 36 points. He made four field goals and all 24 of his extra point attempts.

WENDELL ESKRIDGE THIRD TEAM ALL-REGION

MENOMONIE (December 8, 2007) - UW-Stout defensive back **Wendell Eskridge (Sr, Milwaukee)** was named to the d3football.com All-West Region third team. Eskridge earned first team all-WIAC defensive honors as a defensive back. While playing cornerback for the Blue Devils, he led the team in passes broken up with seven, and his three interceptions trailed only Stephen Schils' total of six. Eskridge's 10 total passes defended put him one back of the conference lead. As a kick returner, Eskridge returned 14 kickoffs for 287 yards, averaging 20.5 yards per return. Eskridge also participated in the Aztec Bowl, Saturday, in Chihuahua, Mexico, where he was a team captain and starter. The USA team defeated Mexico, 37-19, and Eskridge had five tackles, four solo.

WENDELL ESKRIDGE CAPTAIN, TO START IN AZTEC BOWL

CHIHUAHUA, Mexico (December 7, 2007) - UW-Stout defensive back **Wendell Eskridge (Sr, Milwaukee)** was named as a team captain and as a starter in the Aztec Bowl, Blue Devil defensive coordinator **Clayt Birmingham** reported from the site of the game, scheduled for Saturday, Dec. 8. The Aztec Bowl pits a Division III all-star team against the Mexican National Team. Both the starting line-ups and the team captains were selected by a blind draw.

"It's quite an honor," Eskridge said, "even though it was luck of the draw. It's an awesome feeling and I am excited to walk out there for the coin toss."

Birmingham, who will be the American team's defensive coordinator, reports from Chihuahua, Mexico:

"Hello from Mexico,

"Things in Mexico are still going great. We have been here for four days now and yesterday was our last two-a-day practice. We had one practice this morning and then the head coach gave the entire team off this afternoon to tour the city of Chihuahua. (yes, just like the dog).

"We will have a walk through practice tomorrow and then play in the 11th annual Aztec Bowl on Saturday at 5pm. The game will not be televised, but you can listen to the game on the web at www.aztecbowl.com. I have been coordinating the defense and will call the game on defense. Obviously by only having the players for a week, we are going to keep things simple and rotate personnel a lot. It should be fun. We have a great bunch of young men who have gelled very quickly.

"I attached a picture of Wendell Eskridge (our player from UW Stout) and myself. He is doing a great job down here along with Kasey Morgan (UW Stevens Point). These two are the only ones selected from the WIAC. In fact, both will start the game on Saturday due to luck of the draw. Being that they are all great players, we made it fair and drew names to select the starters. This was the players idea.

"AFCA along with USA Football have been doing a great job of doing everything first class. From the nice hotel right downtown, to the meals, practice fields, etc, etc.... Everything has gone well and is done with class."
