- The Data leads program was launched with 30 designated data leads:
 - Data leads will receive training on how to respond to data requests from individuals within their college/unit
 - Data leads will serve as the first point of contact for all data requests within their college/unit



The number of classes held on Fridays increased to 544 in spring 2011, an increase of 38% from the previous year.



As part of the high risk drinking prevention plan, there was a 658% increase in Chapter 17 (student non-academic misconduct) sanctions in 2010-11





From 9/2010 - 4/2011 there were 261 parental contacts for alcohol related policy violations

The Admissions Office coordinated campus visits for 599 ethnic minority students

Data collection has been completed on an indepth qualitative study to understand why minority students at Stout stay until graduation.
